PLANT RESCUE

GLEN ALPS

Explore the alpine flora masked by the fall colors with a special search for the white Aconitum delphinifolium, subsp. delphinifolium, var. albiflorum and Gentiana platypetala.

Regarding collection of Plant material-----We are discouraging this on group outings as we feel it could become a serious problem and is not in the best interest of conservation.

Persons interested in obtaining plants might best contact owners of land destined to development. If the owner is unknown, call the Manicipality on borough zoning and platting dept.

Contact the Dept. of Hy. --Right of Ways-- for new road construction. The Seward Hy. south of McHugh Creek is being worked on this year and has some choice plants. Collection is allowed between the stakes with orange flags, marked with S.S. on them and the road. Please stay out of areas where they are working.

The Chugach Mts. are all State Park until the Chugach National Forest takes over just north of Girdwood.

50 feet back from hy. on state land that is not designated park land.

200 feet back from established trails, roads, and campgrounds in National Forests.

HINTS

If getting plants in an area not to be destroyed, take plent of soil - plant as soon as possible and water well for the first season. Fill the resulting hole with downed plant material, rocks or soil to protect the roots of surrounding plants.
