

### 1996 FIELD TRIP SCHEDULE

#### **General Information:**

The purpose of the Alaska Native Plant Society field trips is to enjoy our Alaskan plants in their native habitats. The trips are designed to explore a variety of plant communities for educational and appreciative values. Hikes are leisurely paced to allow plenty of time for plant observation. Trips will be held rain or shine, so be prepared.

Please read the individual trip listing to determine the level of difficulty, allotted time and special requirements for each trip. Trip leaders' telephone numbers are provided and they are happy to answer specific questions about their trips. <u>Please</u> call the leader a few days before the outing, unforeseen things can come up and plans may change.

#### Items to Bring:

All trips will require sturdy hiking shoes, drinking water (it is unsafe to drink stream water), rain gear, warm clothing and insect repellent. A hand lens is helpful for up close plant identification. You may also wish to bring your camera, binoculars, field notebook, and lunch or snack.

#### Caution:

These are not plant collecting trips! Digging plants and/or collecting specimens is strongly discouraged by the ANPS. Collecting is illegal in many of the locations we will visit.

#### **Meeting Place:**

Unless specifically noted in the field trip description, the common meeting place for ANPS field trips is the southeast corner of the Sears Mall parking lot, located at the intersection of Benson Boulevard and the New Seward Highway. Trip leaders will wait a few minutes for latecomers, but please be prompt.

#### **Celebrating Wildflowers:**

A two week celebration of our native wildflowers is being arranged through various agencies and organizations. Events will be publicized in the Anchorage Daily News and through other media sources. Volunteers are still needed to help with this event. See Page 7 for more details.

Allow approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes to get to Nancy Lakes from Anchorage.

Meeting Place: Carrs at Muldoon and Northern Lights, near the newspaper bins on the N. Lights side. Regroup at 9 a.m. at Arctic Valley, at the Alpenglow Ski Area.

Level of difficulty: Moderate

This area features north and south facing slopes where early and late blooming plants can often be found at the same time. The rocky summit of Rendezvous Peak, elevation 4,050 feet, is an optional side hike (total elevation gain 1,500 feet). Bring lunch, water and rain gear.

Visit alpine meadows full of blooming Bog Candles, Northern Green Bog Orchid, Chocolate Lily, Death Camas, Columbine and Weasel Snout. Hike to an alpine lake and visit an historic gold mine.

Explore gravel bars at Byron Glacier, the Moose Meadows in Girdwood, and spruce / hemlock forest on the Winner Creek Trail. Bring waterproof footwear for the Moose Meadows. If enough people are interested, we may stay for dinner at the Double Musky.

#### June 26 - Wednesday: Mt. Eklutna

Meeting Place: Carrs at Muldoon & Northern Lights, near the newspaper bins on the N. Lights side. Car pooling is recommended as parking at the trailhead is scarce. We will regroup around 9:00 a.m. at "Peter's Creek Bisempis Center" (On the frontage Road off of Glenn Hwy.). To get there take S. Peters Creek exit.

To get to the trailhead turn south (right coming from Anchorage) off of the Frontage Rd. on Ski Rd., right again on Whaley Ave. The name will change to Chugach State Park Dr. at a left bend. Go up steep hill where the name changes again at another sharp left bend to Kullberg. Turn right on Sullins (just before a dead end sign), and take another right on Malcolm.

Level of difficulty: Moderate but long. Minimum age: 5, if a very good hiker.

We will walk through woods on an easy homestead road, then slowly climb through meadows and up into mountain tundra. The area has a few plants more typically found farther north, e.g. *Armeria Maritima* (Thrift) and *Polygonum bistorta* (Pink Plumes). Bring lunch and plenty of water.

## June 29-30 - Saturday & Sunday: Carter and Crescent Lakes

Level of difficulty: Moderate

On Saturday, we will backpack to Crescent Lake via the Carter Lake trail (3.3 miles; total elevation gain 1,050 feet; some stream hopping may be necessary). We will camp and explore around Crescent Lake before returning on Sunday. The hike passes through hemlock forest, subalpine meadows with forget-me-nots, stream violets and chocolate lilies, and up into alpine country. For the adventurous, a steep hike onto the ridge above the lake offers pink poppies and other alpine specialists. Please call if you plan to attend.

All camping gear --tents, sleeping bags, thermal pads, food, etc. is provided. You need only bring your clothing for the two days. Level of difficulty: Moderate - Strenuous

Minimum age: This is a steep hike so kids will need supervision.

This will be a short hike up a steep slope. Snow lingers in this area, so a multitude of wildflowers would still be blooming, including Broad-petaled Gentian (*Gentiana platypetala*). We will climb 1 1/2 miles through tundra to reach alpine lakes and view a glacier. Mountain goats are sometimes seen here. Bring a packed lunch and rain gear. There is camping available a Coeur d' Alene or Porcupine campgrounds. The trailhead is 4.4 miles beyond the campground, at the end of an unmaintained road that is not recommended for large camper vehicles and trailers. It is driveable by most cars in dry weather.

Enjoy the last of summer and the beginning of fall with this canoe trip on the Nancy Lake Canoe Trails. We aim to complete the Lynx Lake Loop (8 miles), paddling through a chain of fourteen forest-rimmed lakes linked by short portages. This is a great opportunity to get intimate with wetland plants! Loons, waterfowl and beavers should also be abundant. We've reserved a cabin at Lynx Lake, but if there's enough demand we'll make extra reservations and maybe also have a tenting group.
