May 8 – Nature Outing: Birds, Plants & Tracks Leader: John Wenger: (ER Visitor Center) Meeting Place: Eagle River Nature Center Meeting Time: 2 PM Trip Time: 1 ½ -2 hours This guided nature walk will cover plants, mammals, birds, tracks and their interrelationships. Bring field guides, binoculars, camera. \$3.00 Parking fee at park entrance.

Be on the lookout for leaf fossils at your feet among the early wildflowers (purple mountain saxifrage is spectacular on top of the hill) and beautiful views of the Matanuska Valley.

Skyline Drive Meeting Time: 7 PM Trip Time: 3 day weekend Friday, 4:30: Dinner at Halibut Cove – meet at 4:30 PM at Central Charters on Cannery Row on The Spit (first cluster of buildings across from Coal Point Trading). Dinner \$10-20 Danny Joe Ferry: \$20 Reservations needed – contact leader with number of people, dress warmly with raincoat for boat ride Saturday, 8 AM: Tour of Daisy Lee Bitter's gardens and yard

9:30-11:30: Calvin and Coyle Trail Hike through an old growth forest of birch and Lutz spruce to an observation platform at the edge of Beluga Wetlands. Early part of the trail is an excellent example of secondary plant succession. A new section of trail – Bitter Trail – is on the wetlands. Informative brochures will be provided.

1:00-3:00: Pratt Museum on Bartlett Street; nominal charge

4:00- Gull Island Tour check-in: Rainbow Tours at Homer Small Boat Harbor. Parking spaces may be hard to find; be prepared to walk several blocks.

4:30 – Gull Island Tour. First stop is at the Field Station of the Center for Alaskan Coastal Studies. Then we circle the Gull Islands' Seabird Rookery for close-up observation of 8 species who nest there: tufted puffins, horned puffins, murres, pigeon guillemots, pelagic cormorants, red-faced cormorants, black-legged kittiwakes, and glaucous-winged gulls. The birds have grown used to presence of tour boats, but will spook at sight of eagle. Cost \$15. Dress warmly for boat trip. 7:30 PM – Potluck at Daisy Lee Bitter's home, visiting with local plant group: Drive

Sunday, 6 AM: Marine and Shore Plants walk guided by Daisy Lee Bitter; emphasis on edible species and algae, and how to prepare them. Low tide: 9 ft @6:45 AM. Meet @ north end of lagoon on Homer Spit (aka "Fishing Hole"). Wear waterproof boots.

After breakfast: Guided tours at the Carl E. Wynn nature Center. Priscilla Russell Kari, who wrote *Tanaina Plantlore-An Ethnobotany of the Dena 'ina Indians of Southcentral Alaska*, will be one of the naturalist guides Cost \$5, checks payable to Alaskan Coastal Studies.

Note: Since parking is scarce at the campgrounds and on Homer Spit, those who wish may park at Daisy Lee Bitter's at (miles east of the intersection of East Hill Road and Skyline Drive. It is yards past the Wynn Nature Center on the bay side of the road. A marks the driveway. Daisy Lee has cabin space for those who want to sleep inside. Call trip leaders to arrange to stay there. Bring your sleeping bag and pad. Bring food for breakfast and lunches. Saturday night bring dish for potluck at Daisy Lee's. Bring swimsuit for hot tub on Saturday night. No pets, due to wildlife. Well-behaved children are welcome.

A special flower will be the Broad-petalled Gentian (*Gentiana platypetala*). Bring sturdy hiking boots, packed lunch, plenty of water and snacks.

June 3-Thursday-10 AM to 2 PM-Chester Creek Bike Trail
