Description: Volunteers are needed to help to eradicate the invasive weed *Tragopogon dubious* (western salsify) from Alaska. This invasive plant grows only in a few places in Turnagain Arm, and is best removed by hand pulling. ANPS members meet every other Tuesday evening in the spring to search for and remove *Tragopogon* from the three primary locations it grows at or near. Volunteers should be prepared to walk or scramble rough terrain in and near active transportation corridors (the shoulder of the Seward Highway, steep adjoining hillsides, etc.) for up to two and half hours at a time. Please do not bring dogs or children. Helpful items include gloves, a sturdy dandelion digger or similar device adequate to loosen rocky compacted soil with, a trash bag to put plants into, and a bright, visible jacket or hat. Rewards include the amazing views over the Arm during quiet summer weekend evenings and the potential for complete eradication of an invasive species from our state by volunteer efforts only.
